

Visitor Rules & Information

- At least ten business days before your visit, you must complete the **Visitor Access Information Form** in its entirety and forward to your host. Please confine all visitor names to one form. Unfortunately, we cannot accept any additions or substitutions after the form has been processed
- You will be required to show a valid ID (an expired ID is not considered as valid). Acceptable forms of identification include: valid government-issued photo ID, US driver's license, DMV issued ID, Military ID and Passport
- No cameras, cell phones or photography devices are to be used onsite
- At all times you must comply with host instructions and public address announcements

PRIOR TO YOUR ARRIVAL, PLEASE ALERT US TO ANY OF THE FOLLOWING

- Any artificial joints or other metal medical implants that might alarm check-point metal detectors
- Any treatment with radioactive medication within the past 90 days or will receive treatment prior to tour
- If you have a pacemaker, mobility impairment, or other special needs

PROCESS FOR ENTERING THE PROTECTED AREA IS AS FOLLOWS

All visitors will process through a security search train to gain access to the Protected Area of the plant. The search train consists of a nitrate detector, metal detector and X-ray machine. Security personnel reserve the right to perform a hand-held metal detector search and/or a physical pat-down search.

Note: In-plant tour participants must be able to ascend multiple flights of stairs, and walk for approximately 1.5 miles unaided.

APPROPRIATE ATTIRE

- All natural clothing - such as cotton, or silk
- Pants, short-sleeved or long-sleeved shirt
- Shoes or boots that have a hard flat sole, leather uppers with both closed-toes and closed-heels. Heels must be less than 1.5 inches tall (as pictured)
- You may be required to wear hard hats, hearing protection and safety glasses (safety equipment will be provided). Visitors may be permitted to wear religious headgear if there is no safety or security concerns
- It can be windy, cold, warm or raining on the day of the tour. Layering is highly recommended



INAPPROPRIATE ATTIRE

- Shorts, skirts or other attire that exposes legs or ankles
- Tank tops or sleeveless shirts
- Tennis shoes, sneakers, sandals, low-cut slip-on, clogs, crocs, or ballet style shoes
